CAS One Health

About the programme

The Certificate of Advanced Studies (CAS) consists of 9 modules and 15 ECTS.

The CAS One Health training programme provides the theoretical and practical foundations of the One Health approach from a variety of interdisciplinary and cross-sectoral prisms. Participants learn to think and collaborate beyond their area of expertise. They deepen their knowledge of systemic issues typical to One Health, focusing on the Swiss and European contexts. The programme is aimed at professionals working in One Health-related positions, particularly in the fields of environmental, plant, animal, and human health, agronomy, social and human sciences, economics, and law.

MODULES

Basic modules

- What is One Health and where is it helpful?
- Thinking, collaborating and generating knowledge across sectors
- One Health in practice
- Operationalisation and communication of One Health

Thematic modules (choose 5 out of 6)

- Climate change, natural resource management and One Health
- Infectious diseases at the ecosystem-animal-human interface
- Antimicrobial resistance and One Health
- Implementation of One Health in the Swiss administration
- Biosafety, biological risks and One Health
- Vector-borne diseases and One Health
